The Stiftung Liebenau – Then and Now

The Stiftung Liebenau was founded in 1870 by an association of Tett nang citizens that had been initiated by Adolf Aich, a local chaplain, with the aim of providing a refuge for people with disabilities and the terminally ill. The Pflege- und Bewahranstalt Liebenau (Liebenau hospital and custodial institution) soon established an excellent reputation both regionally and further afield. By the end of the 19th century, it was home to over 400 people.

Today the Stiftung Liebenau (Liebenau Foundation) is a non-profit-making organization affiliated with the Catholic church. It provides social services, health care and education in Germany, Austria, Italy, Switzerland and Bulgaria. As such, it maintains a wide range of facilities and programmes offering community-focused services for the elderly, persons with disabilities, children and young adults. The Stiftung Liebenau has close ties with two other foundations, Stiftung Hospital zum Heiligen Geist and Stiftung Helios – Leben im Alter.



Health Care

Health Care for Individuals with Special Needs

People with disabilities have a right to the best possible health care. In many cases, professionals working with individuals with cognitive and language impairments require special training. To offer disabled people suffering from mental or physical illnesses the care they need, we run a specialist hospital, centres staffed by qualified social workers and therapists and a psychiatric day clinic. We also run a number of outpatient facilities, of which some are also open to people without disabilities, the elderly and others with special care needs.

Strength for the Future

Education and Training

Every person requires different special skills and knowledge and has individual strengths and abilities. To foster these abilities, it is important to ensure that all people have a chance to live up to their full potential. We run schools for children and young adults with special needs, provide vocational training for young adults with learning disabilities and offer them support in entering the job market. An additional focus of our work is providing professional training for social work or nursing.
